Brush Pick-Up

Mid-April to End of September

1. Brush is to be placed within 10 feet of the road or curb with the cut ends toward the road. Do not pile on roads or sidewalks.
2. Brush pile should be of a size that the road crew can pick up in a reasonable amount of time (20 minutes or less or based on the Road Superintendent's discretion).
3. Brush pile shall not contain any stumps, anything with roots, or root ball still attached
4. Brush pile shall not contain any trash, metals, wire, concrete or any solid waste materials.
5. Limbs shall be no larger than five (5) inches in diameter.
6. Limbs should not be cut into small pieces. Larger pieces work better with the chipper.
7. Limbs/branches smaller than 12 inches in length should be placed in an open container.
8. There should be no mixing of the leaf and brush piles.
9. Limbs/stumps/branches left from a hired commercial tree service will not be collected.

Leaf Pick-Up

Mid-October to End of November

1. Leaves are to be placed within 10 feet of the road or curb. Do not pile on roads or sidewalks. The Road crew uses equipment similar to a vacuum cleaner to collect the leaves.
2. There should be no mixing of the leaf and brush piles.
3. Leaf pile shall not contain any trash, metals, wire, concrete or any solid waste materials.

Drop-Off Program

Outside the regular brush/leaf pick-up or if piles do not comply with the policy, residents may drop off at the Compost/Mulch Facility, 1516 S. Bird Rd. on Tuesday or Thursday 3 to 6 p.m. or Saturday 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Proof of residency is required.

The Compost/Mulch Facility is open April 2 to October 31.

The Road Superintendent shall inform residents if they are not complying with this policy.

Patrol Services

The dedicated personnel provided through the Township's contract with the Clark County Sheriff's Office allows the Township to provide more services to the Township residents. The dedicated deputy means Deputy Shaw does not normally take calls outside the assigned area unless providing back-up support to other Deputies. Dedicated service reduces response time for a call for law enforcement protection and traffic enforcement.

The main advantage to the partnership is the ability to focus on Community Oriented Policing and Problem Solving. The partnership allows more visibility to deter crime in the Township and more time devoted to Township residents' complaints.

Billy started with Springfield Township in June of 2018. He brings more than 28 years of road experience.

The Township Road Department is responsible for maintaining 74 miles of township roadway. The township does not maintain any state or county roadways. Some of the responsibilities of the Road Department include snow and ice removal, road repairs such as crack sealing roads and pothole repair, ditch and storm sewer cleaning, catch basin repairs, sign installations and repairs, roadside mowing, pavement markings and repair of curbing and road resurfacing.

The Road Department staff includes the Road Superintendent and six (6) Road Maintenance Crew Members. The Springfield Township Road Department Garage is located at 705 E. Leffel Lane. Call 937-322-0253 to report road concerns.

2023 Road Projects Completed

Resurfacing of Vale and Victory Road

Resurfacing of Vale Road and Victory is complete. The project was funded by Springfield Township, Bethel Township (portion of Victory Road in Bethel Township) and the Ohio Public Works Commission.

Resurfacing of E. Leffel Lane

Resurfacing of E. Leffel Lane from S. Burnett Road to Old Selma Road is complete. The project was funded by Springfield Township and the Ohio Public Works Commission.

Resurfacing of Sunset, Rocket and Boadview

Resurfacing of Sunset Ave., Rocket Ave, and Broadview Dr. is complete. The project was funded by Springfield Township and by a grant from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG).

Road resurfacing is determined by pavement condition. Roads are constantly being evaluated and ranked for repairs based on condition.
